Call to Order

Chairman Ron Wolff called the meeting to order.

Consideration of Minutes – April 26, 2021

The Honorable Robert Crockett made a motion to accept the April 26, 2021 minutes. Marilyn Ailes seconded the motion. The motion was carried with two abstentions, Barry Brooks and Shannon Alexander were absent from the meeting.

Old Business & Updates

Linda stated that they had 235 bales of recycling awaiting pickup by TFC. Linda stated that there is a 40 yd can on order for Painter so we can move the TFC cans off the site. She also stated that an additional compactor has been approved for Horntown. A discussed ensued.

Stewart stated that three bids were received for the Horntown compactor and that the low bid was actually under budget. It is his understanding that the compactor was ordered today but he doesn't have confirmation yet. A discussion ensued.

Stewart stated that he has the list of roads that were cleaned by our Litter Crew. Linda reported on the roadside cleanup tonnage which was 138 and the miles cleaned which was 2.8. Linda stated that the same crew was picking up appliances, batteries, etc and taking them to the convenience centers. Honorable Robert Crockett stated that a lot of multi-tasking was going on. Chairman Wolff stated that he knew the number of probationers was down because court was not being held. He asked if that had changed. Linda stated that court proceedings had resumed. Linda stated that Stewart had been doing a wonderful job and that he had picked up 15 bags this month. A discussion ensued.

Stewart stated that the pre-construction meeting for the Northern Landfill Western Expansion Project was held yesterday. Chairman Wolff commented that he was at the landfill and saw the activity. Stewart stated that this was the first time they had worked with The Harnden Group. A discussion ensued.

Stewart talked about the new boating facilities parking permit and mentioned that it might be an option for controlling improper usage of convenience centers. He stated that it would cost about \$27,000 per year to mail these out. Linda suggested that they be passed out at the convenience center sites. A discussion ensued.

New Business

Marilyn stated that they have money left over in their Waste Watchers account. She stated that they were thinking about hiring an intern or retiree to work about 10 hours per week. She suggested that the new hire could develop a handout explaining the new law coming out after 2025 on styrofoam usage. The handout could be distributed to local restaurants and stores. A discussion ensued.

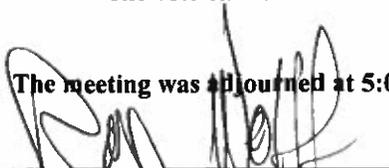

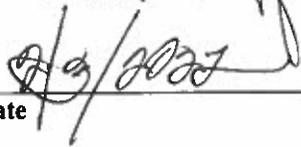
Adjournment
