Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor Ron Wolff. April 3, 2013 minutes were approved. Robert made a motion to accept the motion with corrections and Jenny O'Neill seconded the motion.

Stewart spoke about the Fall Clean up event. A discussion ensued.

Greg spoke about the Transfer Station being 85% to 95% complete with the Southern Landfill Closure being 98% complete with grass starting to pop up. He encouraged everyone to go and look at it. He also stated the Transfer Station is supposed to be done on November 17, 2013.

Ken spoke about the spray irrigation at the North Landfill as far as the seeding and fertilization and that the spraying would start on Friday.

Greg stated a tree company came in to remove some of the trees at the Chincoteague Convenience Center and that our goal is to expand the site. Greg gave directions of where the Grangeville Convenience Center would be. A lengthy discussion ensued.

Greg stated that the litter vacuum is here and the tractor should be here this week or next week. He has stated that the purchase order was issued for the boom and we don't have one yet for the bat wing mower. A discussion ensued.

Stewart discussed the remaining greenbox sites, which are ESCC and Assateague. He stated that the study they did showed ESCC had 17 tons and Assateague had 9.5 tons last year, with a cost of \$800 for the whole program. A lengthy discussion ensued.

Stewart talked about the committee vacancy. The committee was set up to have five members; two Board of Supervisors, three citizens in which two members would serve 3 year terms and 1 member would serve a two year term. A discussion ensued.

Greg discussed credit card machines. A discussion ensued.

Stewart discussed a request to consider changing the landfill hours to 7: 30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. A discussion ensued.

Stewart and Greg discussed the options for delivering solid waste information to the public. A discussion ensued.
