**Call to Order**

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor Wolff. Supervisor Crockett made a motion to accept the May 27, 2015 minutes and Marilyn Ailes seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Chontese discussed the Assign-a-Highway statics with graphs passed out to everyone. She discussed the Goodwill container and the picking up of those items. She stated that she is trying to get recycling going in the school systems. Supervisor Wolff stated that if the schools get on board with the recycling this could help solve our litter problem. A discussion ensued.

Greg spoke about the litter crew and their litter vacuuming of roads along with cutting grass at the landfills. A discussion ensued. Supervisor Wolff asked the question of: How do the roads get selected for trash pickup? Greg stated he gets the supervisor to ride the road and check it out to see which category of cleaning it needs to be on. Supervisor Crockett had a question for Greg as far as the pickup of the litter as far as tons, miles, etc.

Greg spoke on Grangeville that we are close to 90% complete. A discussion ensued.

Stewart spoke on consideration a policy regarding lost valuables at our Solid Waste facilities. Supervisor Wolff stated for him to come up with a plan and report back to the committee for the next meeting. A discussion ensued.

Stewart spoke on the beetle-killed trees that happen about a year ago and there were approximately 7 tons since Christmas. Supervisor Crockett asked Stewart to contact Supervisor Thornton to determine if she sees a need for us to continue accepting the beetle-killed trees.

Stewart spoke about considering a permit/decal system for convenience centers and the Solid Waste facilities. Stewart stated that Supervisor Wolff had gotten some more complaints about out of town County residents who are using our convenience centers. A discussion ensued.

**Tim Lee from TFC Recycling spoke and gave a presentation regarding curbside recycling. A discussion ensued.**
